1. Welcome (DF)

DF welcomed everyone to the meeting.

2. Minutes of Meeting 25th April 2022

4. Organisation and Facilities Management

a. GDPR Policy Document (DF/TM)

Notes for information: TM has kindly drafted two documents (attached) regarding data protection: a volunteer agreement and a policy statement.

Proposal: that the attached GDPR Policy document and Volunteer Agreement (amended as necessary post meeting) are adopted by the WN.

Two documents were presented: a Data Protection Agreement - to be signed by volunteers who had access to people's personal data; and, a General Policy relating to GDPR. These documents were briefly reviewed and discussed in the meeting. With minor modifications, it was agreed to adopt these policy documents for use in the charity.

7. Project Updates

a. The Planetarian Food Project (SF/JD)

Notes for information: DF has completed training for his Level Three Food Hygiene Certificate. We ran our first community cooking event on 8^{th} July as part of the Climate Club. We have two more planned events: a supper for visitors from Mayen, Germany (part of the town twinning activity), Tuesday 2^{nd} August; a supper for the Godalming Rotarian Group, Monday 7^{th} November.

SF updated the meeting on the activities outlined above. She reported that the event planned for the 2nd August was likely to involve ~15 guest from Mayen and a small number of the hosts. Planetarian Food dishes would be made in the What Next catering kitchen and also provided by volunteers. Some entertainment would also be provided by You Ukes.

DF reported back to the meeting on the activities relating to the What Next Lounge. In general, it was felt that these regular outings on Godalming High Street were useful in raising the general profile of the charity within Godalming. It was noted that engagement was varied

c. Eco-Theatre Group & Earth Sprite Project (SF/DF)

Notes for information: the new production, the Earth Sprite Puppet Show, presented in our Eco-Puppet Theatre was performed on 9th July and will also be performed at the Godalming Green Gala. An Earth Sprite Workshop is planned for Godalming Staycation (13th August), along with other Earth Sprite activities.

It was reported that the Earth Sprite Puppet show was premiered on 9th July in Crown Court, three shows were performed for members of the public in Godalming; the show will be performed again at the Godalming Green Gala. Am Earth Sprite workshop has also been arranged for Godalming Staycation later this week.

d. TerraCycle Project (DF)

Notes for information: we now have two TerraCycle stations in the Venue, one for plastic packaging (provided by Live Your Values) and one for stationary materials (provided by Evolve Leadteam).

Tristan Scrivens was approached about putting the Terracycle boxes in the lobby, but it was decided that this would not be appropriate. DF has been monitoring the boxes since the last meeting. The plastic recycle box had been used by a number of members / supporters; the stationary box has had limited use.

ACTION: DF to monitor use on-going.

e. Exhibition Space Project (SF)

Notes for information: a new exhibition of art from Art Venture is now on display in the Centre; the Our Other Mother exhibition has been stored and will be re-displayed later in the year.

SF reported to the meeting that Art Venture, a charity supporting adults with learning disabilities or physical impairments, are currently exhibiting art in the venue produced by their members; all of the art relates to the natural world.

8. Partnership Project: Godalming Climate Forum & Climate Hub for Godalming (DF/SF)

Notes for information: we have previously organised events on behalf of the Godalming Climate Forum and we are planning further events. Alongside this GCF activity, there is a possibility that WN could become a Climate Hub for Godalming with the support of the Godalming Town Council (GTC). It has been suggested that we put a proposal together for GTC to consider (proposal attached). **Proposal**: that WN submit this proposal (as amended post-meeting) to GTC.

It was reported that initial discussions had been held regarding What Next becoming a Climate Hub for Godalming. Further progress will be reported to the next meeting.

ACTION: DF / SF to follow-up on this project with Godalming Town Council.

9. Partnership Project: Repair Café Godalming (DF/IC)

Notes for information: this is an initiative from Godalming Rotary. The café will run on the fourth Saturday for each month. SF and DF have attended the two sessions run so far; DF (on a personal basis) has undertaken some PAT Testing.

Proposal: that WN actively support and promote this initiative and, as circumstances determine, engage directly with this project.

It was reported that the Godalming Rotarians had successfully launched their Repair Café initiative. It was agreed that What Next should actively support and promote this activity. Both DF and SF will be volunteering for the Café, SF would be organising Tea / Coffee and DF would be providing PAT Testing service. We would also be able to promote What Next at the café sessions.

10. Update: What Next as the Mayor's Charity (SF)

Notes for information: as of 19^{th} May 2022, What Next became the official charity of the Mayor of Godalming.

a. Activities to Date (SF)

Notes for information: the **Mayor's Garden Party** was held on 19^{th} June; we attended the High Sheriff of Surrey's promotional event on 23^{rd} June; Tales from the Great Wood was presented on 22^{nd} June.

SF reported back on the Mayor's Garden Party, which was our first outing as the mayor's charity; this proved a great opportunity to raise awareness of What Next to the broader community in Godalming. SF also reported that 52 tickets were sold for Tales from the Great Wood; including volunteers, the event was attending by over 60 people. Tickets sales yielded an income of £470 and donations and the raffle raised a further £177.02. The cost for the Bad Apple theatre group was £450. As this was an event for the mayor's charity these funds would reside with the town council until May 2023.

b. The Mayor's Quiz (SF)

Fundraiser: annual event for the Mayor's Charity, likely timing November, ecothemed – quiz to be run by DF.

Notes for information: this event has now been organised for Friday 4^{th} November.

It was reported that the mayor's quiz was booked for 4th November to be held in the Wilfrid Noyce Centre. The event is to be run as a BYO event for both food and drink. There will be a raffle – donations to be sought – and an entry fee: £5 to £10 to be decided. DF will write the quiz and in order to emphasise the climate change related purpose of the charity, the scoring system will be based on carbon emissions – details to follow.

ACTION: DF to prepare the quiz; SF to secure raffle prizes.

The Ecotheatre group would similarly be taking a break after performing at the Green Gala. DF reported that a regular series of on-line Climate Action workshops is planned for the Autumn in collaboration with Climate Interactive.

ACTION: DF to arrange and publicise Climate Action Workshop with Climate Articulate.
